	Cllr Shulman said that at the initial meeting it was stated that it would cost between £15 – £20,000 to fund the court case and £5,000 had been raised.

	ii) connections at Hellifield must be co-ordinated to maximise onward travel options

	iv) competitive fares which at least match those available by alternative routes e.g. Ramsgreave & Wilpshire to Carlisle via Preston and to Leeds via Blackburn
